Welcome back to school and to your child's final year with us!

We are so pleased to be your child's class teachers and we are looking forward to working with you and your child, as we return to school. This is a year of responsibility and growth, please help your child be as independent as possible, help them take responsibility for revising and improving their skills as well completing all homework tasks. This will help them in Year 7 next year!


<p>Reading Children will have a reading book and diary and will be expected to read daily and write comments and this will be checked by us daily. This is their job- children are expected to write a comment of what is happening in the part of the book they have just read. Their Reading Book and Diary MUST come to school each day. Children will also take part in Vipers reading sessions, which supports comprehension.</p> 	<p>Writing In writing we will be developing our skills to write for different purposes and lengths. Developing our sentence structure and especially how to engage the reader in our choice of words. This term we will be writing:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • non chronological reports • diaries • letters • description of setting and characters • character actions and thoughts alongside revising the rules for speech <p>At the start of each unit children are asked to write a cold task which is unsupported work based on the unit and by the end of the unit they will have a hot task implementing all the different skills learnt in the lessons leading up to it.</p>	<p>SPAG We will be recapping previous learning during three weekly sessions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Different types of nouns • Fronted adverbials • Prepositions • Adjectives • Verbs and adverbs • Conjunctions • Types of sentences • Speech rules <p>Spellings Weekly spellings will be bought home every Monday with the spellings in continuous cursive handwriting. The children will be tested within class each week (on a Thursday).</p> 
<p>Mathematics We will be concentrating on the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Place value of numbers up to ten million by reading, writing, ordering and comparing • Rounding of whole numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 and using this skill to estimate the answers to calculations. • All four operations - Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division- the focus of these lessons will be ensuring that the children can use a written method for $+$ $-$ \times \div and apply it to the arithmetic test • long division will be taught this term- this is a new skill that the children will learn • Fractions • Reading metric measurements and being able to convert between them (Length, Mass and Capacity) and problem-solving tasks.

Creative Curriculum In autumn 1, we will be studying WW2, the causes and the affect it had on Great Britain. We will look at key political leaders and what decisions they made. We will investigate the technology used during the war as well as key events such as Battle of Britain, Dunkirk and Anne Frank. We will also be visiting the Imperial War Musuem on 1st October. More details to follow.




During October, as part of 'Black History Month' we will be looking at how and why the Windrush generation re-built Britain.




In Autumn 2, our Geography unit we will be looking at why trade and economics and why they are important for the growth of the country and how trade links to profit and development.
