

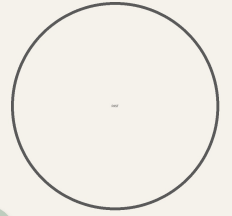

- Children also choose a book from our class library to enjoy in school.

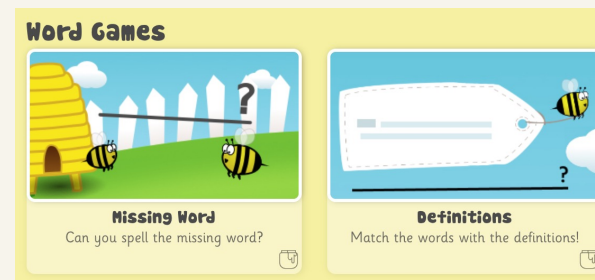
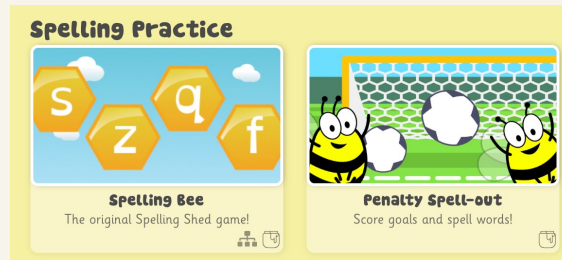
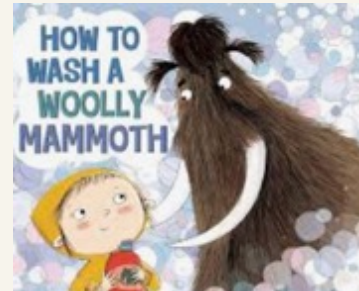
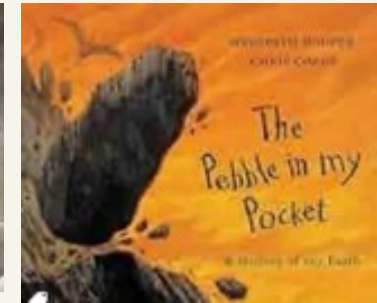
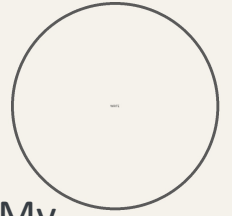


Talk about the book too — ask questions and share ideas!

- No other formal weekly homework; topic projects may be set each half term.

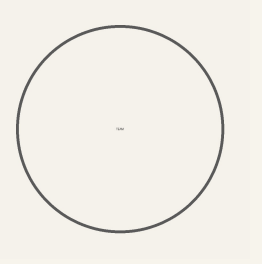

- We value positive communication between home and school.

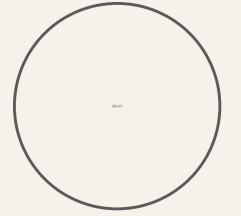

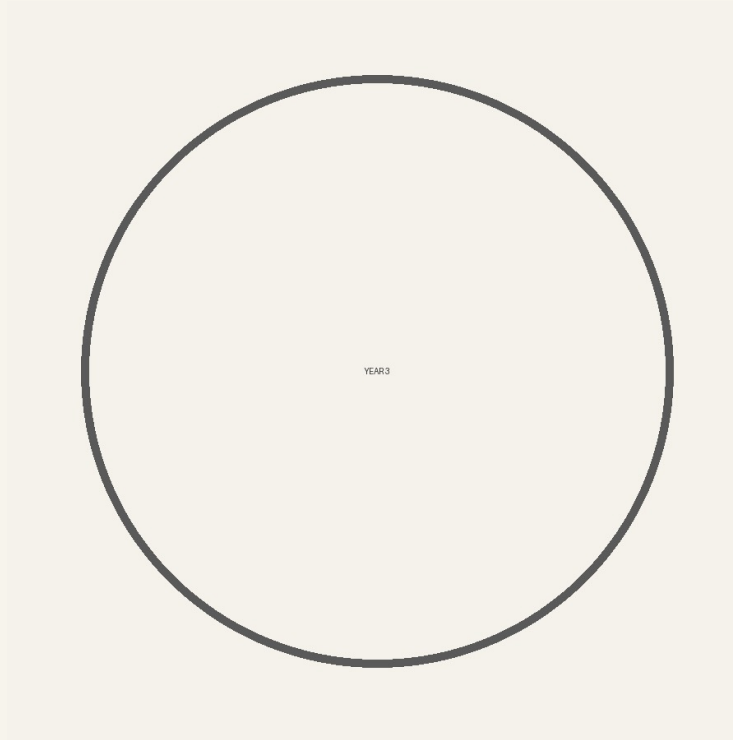
